SUMMER UPDATES:

GRANTS:

In June our grant application for Digitization Project Materials was approved by The Northern Neighbours Foundation Board of Directors under their Moffat Family Fund in June.

Purpose of this Project: Digitization and Modernization of Oral Histories and Exhibits:

This project will allow us to: A) Document our history. B) Modernize.

For this project we require the following equipment, some of which will be purchased with the grant money - Digital Recorder (2); External Hard Drive (2); Digital Camera; Design Software (Canva); Printer; Producing Audio Clips Transcription Software (Descript); Playback Equipment Audio Player (9); SD Cards (20); Trigger Systems (18); Speakers (9); Power Supplies (9); Construction of Pedestals (9)

Much work goes into preparation and submission of grant applications (some more than others) all done by volunteers as well as the contractors & suppliers of material in some cases. We appreciate all those who give their time to provide us with quotes. So, when a grant is not approved it affects many more than just the museum. We are disappointed to learn that our grant to offset a summer student employee as well as our application for a new outdoor artifact building were not approved. We did however receive approval for a Red River Metis Student, but unfortunately no one applied.
